



TYPE OF GOVER	NMENT:
	<b>ANARCHY</b> is a situation where there is no government. This can happen after a civil war in a country, when a government has been destroyed and rival groups are fighting to take its place. Anarchists are people who believe that government is a bad thing. They say it stops people organizing their own lives.
	In a <b>CAPITALIST</b> or free-market country, people can own their own businesses and property. People can also buy services for private use, such as healthcare. But most capitalist governments also provide their own education, health and welfare services.
	In a <b>COMMUNIST</b> country, the government owns things like businesses and farms. It provides its people's healthcare, education and welfare.
	In a <b>DEMOCRACY</b> , the government is elected by the people. Everyone who is eligible to vote has a chance to have their say over who runs the country.
	<b>DICTATORSHIP:</b> This is a country ruled by a single leader. The leader has not been elected and may use force to keep control. In a military dictatorship, the army is in control.
	<b>FEDERAL GOVERNMENT:</b> In this type of system, a central government shares power with a number of small local governments. The USA is a type of this, called a federal republic.
	A <b>MONARCHY</b> has a king or queen. In some traditional monarchies, the monarch has absolute power. But a constitutional monarchy, like the UK, also has a democratic government that limits the monarch's control.
	<b>SOCIALISM</b> is a way to organize a society. It deals mostly with the economy, or the part of a society that creates wealth. The goal of socialism is to spread wealth more evenly and to treat all people fairly. Goods are produced and distributed based on need rather than on market forces such as profitability, price and consumers' purchasing power. In a socialist economy, workers contribute to society based on their ability and receive according to their needs, rather than being paid wages and using that money to purchase what they want.
	<b>TOTALITARIAN STATE:</b> This is a country with only one political party. People are forced to do what the government tells them and may also be prevented from leaving the country.




